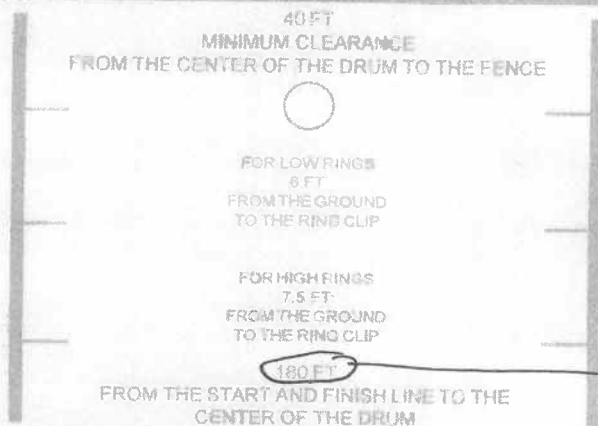


PLAYDAY RULES RINGS



Adjust as needed

DESCRIPTION OF RACE

The rider carries the ring spear holding the spear within 8 inches of the base - while racing down one side of the arena spearing rings, around the drum, returning down the opposite side of the arena while spearing the rings on that side of the arena, then across the start and finish line. The rider may run either a right or left pattern, high or low rings.

EQUIPMENT

Six plastic rings, white with red or orange fluorescent stripes in a barber pole design, to be made from material 1/4 to 3/8" in thickness with a 5 inch diameter inside, to be attached three on each side of the arena fence as follows: on a post approximately 9 feet tall or taller, on an arm, extending out over the arena 30 inches; with a 24 inch strap attached to the arm with a clothespin, clip or Velcro strip attached to the end of the strap to hold the rings. The height from the fastener to the ground will be 6 feet for low rings, and 7 feet 6 inches for high rings. The first ring will be 30 feet from the start and finish line. There will be 45 feet between the other two rings. There should be sufficient rings to keep the game moving.

A ring spear which is a tapered rod similar to a billiard cue, a minimum of 30 inches in length, with a shield 8 inches from the base end.

A plastic weighted drum placed at the end of the arena, in the center, 180 feet from the start and finish line or a minimum of 40 feet from the end of the arena.

JUDGES

One judge at the start and finish line and as many judges as necessary to observe the pattern and to properly replace rings before each contestant runs.

PENALTIES

A 5 second penalty will be added to the rider's time for knocking over or steadying the drum.

A 2 second penalty will be added to the rider's time for each ring that is not on the spear when the finish line is crossed.

DISQUALIFICATION

Breaking the pattern.

Failure to have at least two rings on the ring spear when the finish line is crossed.

Failure to hold the ring spear within 8 inches of the base.
